Dear Sir,

I write to you from Citizen consumer and civic Action Group (CAG). We are a 34 year old non-profit, non-political and professional organisation working towards protecting citizens' rights in consumer, civic and environmental issues and promoting good governance processes including transparency, accountability, and participatory decision-making.

I write this regarding the Draft Environmental Impact Assessment Notification 2020, which was uploaded in the MoEFCC Website on March 12, 2020, with a view to receive public comments within 60 days. The purpose of such an effort is to elicit comments from as many people as possible, which is especially significant for a legislation as this which has far-reaching impacts.

However, the current situation is not conducive for such an effort, in light of the enormous challenges posed by the outbreak of the pandemic COVID-19. Panic has seized the country since late January, when the first positive case was reported in Kerala. On the day the draft was uploaded by the MoEFCC for public comments, India had 74 confirmed cases of COVID-19, including its first casualty, and the World Health Organisation had already declared the outbreak a pandemic. Following restrictions in place by then by several states including Kerala, Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu to contain the outbreak, the entire country entered a 21-day period of complete lockdown, two weeks later.

Very significant as a precautionary measure, 'social distancing' has led to a scramble for access to basic resources for the people. These extraordinarily hard circumstances will severely limit the ability of the public to access, analyse and share their comments on the Notification. Civil Society Organisations and the media, who are key stakeholders in the public consultation for any proposed legislation, are also occupied with the challenges posed by the public health crisis.
