

<u>China provides \$1 billion in 'green'</u> <u>finance to coal projects in first half</u> <u>of the year</u>

China continues to fund coal projects, often using funds meant for RE. In the first half of this year, 141 million tonnes of coal mining capacity has been approved, as against 25 million tonnes for the whole of 2018




<u>Cabinet allows 100% FDI in coal</u> <u>mining via automatic route</u>

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs has approved 100 percent foreign direct investment through the automatic route for sale of coal, coal mining and, related activities



SO2 emission, TN worst in India, Chennai No. 29 in world

According to a new report by Greenpeace, Tamil Nadu has the highest SO2 levels in India due to burning of low quality coal (lignite) in Neyveli, and high concentration of coal power plants without FGD in Chennai, Mettur and Thoothukudi



Sharp year-on-year decline in coal lending in 2018

According to Centre for Financial Accountability, coal lending saw a decline of 90% in 2018 as compared to 2017. Out of total lending of Rs.30,524 crore, 80% went to the renewable energy sector while only 20% went to the coal-based power projects.
